## 3. Reason for change

**Changing to my married name**  
Attach a certified copy of marriage certificate\*

**Changing to my former name due to divorce**  
Attach a certified copy of decree nisi (Court Divorce Order) and either a birth certificate or marriage certificate showing former name\*.

**Changing to a new name**  
Attach a certified copy of a birth certificate showing change of name or a change of name certificate.

\*A marriage certificate that was issued overseas must show an official crest and the registration number. It must also have been provided by the equivalent body of births, deaths and marriages in the foreign country.

## Certification requirements

**Take the original and copy of your identification documents to one of the certifiers listed below.**

- A person who is enrolled on the roll of the Supreme Court of a State or Territory, or the High Court of Australia, as a legal practitioner (however described).
- A judge of a court.
- A magistrate.
- A chief executive officer of a Commonwealth court.
- A registrar or deputy registrar of a court.
- A Justice of the Peace.
- A notary public (for the purposes of the Statutory Declaration Regulations 2018).
- A police officer.
- An agent of the Australian Postal Corporation who is in charge of an office supplying postal services to the public.
- A permanent employee of the Australian Postal Corporation with 2 or more years of continuous service who is employed in an office supplying postal services to the public.
- An Australian consular officer or an Australian diplomatic officer (within the meaning of the Consular Fees Act 1955).
- An officer with 2 or more continuous years of service with 1 or more financial institutions (for the purposes of the Statutory Declaration Regulations 2018).
- A finance company officer with 2 or more continuous years of service with 1 or more finance companies (for the purposes of the Statutory Declaration Regulations 2018).
- An officer with, or authorised representative of, a holder of an Australian Financial Services Licence (AFSL), having 2 or more continuous years of service with one or more licensees.
- A member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia, CPA Australia or the National Institute of Accountants with 2 or more years of continuous membership.

**The certifier must include the following on each page of the copy of the documents they are certifying:**

- Text for single page documents: "This is to certify that this is a true copy of the original which I have sighted".
- Text for multiple page documents: "This is to certify that this page, and the following <insert number> pages, are a true copy of the original which I have sighted".
- Full printed name
- Occupation
- Professional/employee number (if applicable) and/or address
- Registration number (if applicable)
- Date the document was certified

Documents certified with an Industry Standard stamp are acceptable if the above details are included.

Note: We don't accept photocopied certification documents.
